


Emergency flood alerts have been issued, and more than 200,000 homes and businesses are still without power.

He was getting into his Ute and slid his legs in, then sat up in the car and proceeded to take the wheels off his chair and lift the parts into his Ute. He is married with a son, and works full-time in a parts distribution centre. In his spare time, he is restoring two cars and maintaining a drift car with hand controls so he can pursue his dream. What an inspiration to me and all who know him.

What an incredible story of resilience and determination. That young man is truly an inspiration, showing how far sheer willpower and passion can take someone, even in the face of such adversity. His ability to juggle a family, full-time work, and still pour his energy into his dreams—building and maintaining drift cars—is beyond impressive.

He's a reminder that life's challenges can be met head-on and that a disability doesn't define one's abilities or ambitions. Stories like his are powerful motivators for everyone, proving that perseverance can lead to a fulfilling and adventurous life. It's people like him who remind us to embrace our passions and tackle obstacles with the same determination.
